

The Energy Footprint Tool is back!



The Energy Footprint is now open for churches to submit their 2024 energy bill data via the <u>Parish Returns website</u>, until the tool closes on the 30th June. The EFT is easy to use, should take less than an hour to complete and provides vital baseline information for work towards Net Zero Carbon.

With 2024 being the hottest year on record, our work towards safeguarding creation and cutting our carbon is more urgent than ever. Completing the tool will help your church understand its carbon footprint and will mean you may be eligible for grants to help kickstart your net zero projects.

It's simpler than you think - visit the <u>guidance page</u> and reach out to <u>Sophie Roberts</u>, our Diocesan Environmental Officer with any questions. We recommend sitting down with a hot drink and completing the tool soon, while you still have last year's bills to hand.

COP29 Reflections - Bishops Call for Bolder Action

Following COP29, the Bishop of Norwich Graham Usher and Archbishop Julio Murray called on leaders to be bolder in working for climate finance that offers hope.

The Anglican Communion delegation, which included Archbishop Julio Murray from Panama, called for negotiations at COP29 in Azerbaijan to prioritise peace, to listen to the wisdom of indigenous communities, and to work for justice, in particular for climate finance.




The Church of England have released their 2025 Environment Calendar! This is the go-to resource for key environmental awareness dates, and great for displaying.
