

## 🔯 Time to Fill in the Energy Footprint Tool



This is your reminder to fill in the Energy Footprint Tool on the <u>Parish Returns website</u> while you still have last year's bills to hand. The tool calculates your carbon footprint, giving you a useful report to help you better understand your energy usage. It only takes **around 20 minutes** to fill in depending on how many buildings you are reporting on.

Completing the tool will also be necessary to be **eligible for net zero grant opportunities** - **so make sure to tick it off the list as soon as possible**. The data gathered from the tool is vital for tracking carbon emissions on a Diocesan and National level, so we kindly ask

you to join the churches who have already started filling in the tool. Let's push our completion rate up from last year's 58%!

#### Climate & Nature News

Rosebank Oil & Gas Field Approval Overturned

In a huge climate win, January brought the news that the approval for new drilling at the Rosebank Oil and Gas Field has been ruled unlawful and overturned!

This was a major win for the climate, driven by people power. The court's decision means that Rosebank cannot go ahead without fully accounting for the significant carbon emissions it would produce.

However, the campaign still needs support to stop the project being reapproved. This decision will set an important precedent as the government considers whether to end new oil and gas drilling for good.

## Climate & Nature Bill Result



The Climate and Nature Bill had its Second Reading in Parliament in January, where MPs unfortunately decided to end the debate, delaying the vote until 11 July.

While this was not the ideal outcome, there are still reasons to have hope. Jo Chamberlain, National Environment Officer for the Church of England said: "It was disappointing that the Climate and Nature bill was not allowed to proceed to a vote. But despite this, the bill has already had a positive impact. Government ministers have spoken about looking at binding commitments that would make a meaningful difference for climate and nature. It's now our task to keep the pressure on and make sure those commitments are realised."

## Ash Wednesday No Faith in Fossil Fuels Service - St John's Waterloo




Green Week Eco Pilgrimage
