Big Butterfly Count



Become a citizen scientist between 18th July and 10th August by taking part in the Big Butterfly Count. Your sightings help track species trends, support conservation, and monitor climate change impacts on species.

To take part, simply download a butterfly chart from the <u>website</u> or use the app, choose a spot to spend 15 minutes in nature, and record the butterflies you see. Submit your count online or via the app and explore the map to see how your findings contribute to nationwide conservation efforts.

St Augustine's Courses



Are you, or your congregation, unsure about what the environmental crisis means for faith and discipleship? Would you like to be better equipped to integrate creation literacy into your worship and theology?




After several heatwaves already this year, we have all been feeling the heat. Whilst some of us enjoy the hot weather, others are particularly vulnerable during the intense temperatures.
