⚖️ Jubilee: The Justice, Peace & Integrity of Creation Conference 2025

On 8th November we held our JPIC 'Jubilee' Conference - a day rooted in God's heart for justice and peace. With a number of workshops and talks, we reflected on how churches can faithfully respond to issues of social action, social justice, and creation care.

Environmental action was a focus of the day. A workshop led by our Diocesan Environment Officer, Sophie Roberts, together with Eco Champion, Catharina Stibe Hickson (St Mary's Oxted), explored how churches can take meaningful local action for climate justice. A highlight for many was hearing from Rosamund Kissi-Debrah, CEO of the [Ella Roberta Foundation](#), who shared her daughter Ella's story and spoke about the Foundation's vital campaigning work since her passing - including the push for the proposed *Ella's law*, which would require the government to bring air quality up to World Health Organisation standards. Her words offered a powerful reminder that air pollution is not only an environmental issue - but a matter of health, social justice, and racial justice.

⌚ COP30 Reflections and Upcoming Debrief



The 30th United Nations summit on climate change has now drawn to a close, leaving mixed reactions. Whilst the outcome delivered important steps, including an agreement to triple adaptation finance, stronger mechanisms to support a just transition, and renewed global cooperation, many are disappointed by the failure to include fossil fuels in the final deal.

Warmer Home Advice and Grants this Winter



This winter, there are people in our communities who will be facing fuel poverty. But, there is support available that we can signpost vulnerable people in our parish towards, to keep people warmer and safer.

For those in the Surrey area of our Diocese, households may be eligible for a free home visit from a **Home Energy Advice Team (HEAT)**. These are teams of energy champions who give advice on cutting bills, staying warm and at the same time, reducing carbon. They also give out free insulation materials and refer some of the most vulnerable households for free retrofitting from Surrey County Council.

As a church you can do something simple to help - put up a poster (download [here](#)) and advertise it in your notices. Head to their [website](#) and watch this [video](#) from the Diocese of Guildford to find out more.

For Londoners on low incomes, support is also available. The **Warm Homes: Local Grant** scheme offers free or subsidised home improvements for eligible households, with aims of tackling fuel poverty whilst also cutting carbon. Check eligibility and find out more [here](#).
