📢 The Energy Footprint Tool Opens for Churches



The Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) is now open for churches to input their 2025 energy bill data on [Parish Returns](#).

The EFT helps churches to measure their carbon footprint, and can identify areas to reduce it and lower energy bills. Completing the tool is also an essential step in being more eligible for grant funding, and for playing a wider role in the Church of England's mission to care for people and the planet.

Last year, we were delighted that **75%** of churches in our Diocese completed the tool - a fantastic increase from the previous year's **58%**. This year, we hope even more churches will take part. To find out more and for support with filling it in, head to our EFT [blog](#) page.




Revd Dr Sharon Moughtin transporting equipment by cargo bike for St Mary's, whose congregation worships outdoors and does not have a building.

New session dates for our foundation-level training, **Foundations for Creation Care** are now available for 2026.


In these 90-minute sessions led by our Diocesan Environmental Officer, we explore what it means to love God and our neighbour in the context of the climate and nature crisis, and


National Emergency Briefing on Climate & Nature
