We want to release our full potential

We already do a lot to nurture people through our varied worship, supporting individuals in need, providing advice in emergencies, working with uniformed organisations and with charities, especially our partners in the Crypt and, of course, through our Festival. We'd like to touch others, share our good fortune, and help to improve and enrich even more lives.

We have great ambitions too

Our Christianity and our God-given location motivate us not to stand still. To support people of every kind we want to unlock the potential of our site through the Bridge at Waterloo project.

What is holding us back? Why don't we do what we know we could – and more?

Lack of money. At present, as a congregation we do not even fully pay our way - only about half of it. Both our churches are exceptionally fortunate in having rental and lettings income. This has shielded us from the reality of low congregational giving. Our parish needs nearly £9,000 every month just to run the churches and make our contribution to the Diocesan fund which pays for our clergy. Currently we send the Diocese £3,500 per month, which is only two thirds of what we receive in return. So we're being subsided by other churches!

Only after we have covered our costs in full - £9,000 a month - can we put money into those activities we as a parish feel are essential to fulfil our purpose – our ministry and mission in Waterloo and beyond.

Today we are not in a strong enough position to do all we should and more. We could do so much if our funding was greater and more secure.

Our ambitions cannot be realised without your financial support. To unlock our potential and show Christianity in action, as individuals we have to engage and we have to do something about our personal giving. It's as simple as that.

- We can't continue to rely on others
- We need you, and your financial support.
