WHY WOULD I LIKE TO SERVE ON GENERAL SYNOD?

- I believe with my experience and knowledge I can make relevant and helpful contributions to upcoming agenda items and debates to help the church be effective in its mission and ministry in this generation.
- I am grateful for the synodical process of the Church of England which brings together clergy, laity and a range of perspectives and through listening and debate aims to discern the right path for the church and all God's people.
- In Christ we are one body, many members and I believe the full spectrum of the Church of England should be well represented on Synod. I would represent female clergy and the voice of women more generally.

MY PERSPECTIVE AND PRIORITIES

- During my faith journey I have found my home in a variety of churches from evangelical to central to more catholic and have found that in our diversity we make up the beautiful body of Christ. All traditions have a vital contribution to make and we can learn from each other.
- I also believe that every person is God's beloved child, whatever their socio-economic background, ethnicity, age, ability, gender or sexual orientation. All are an equal part of God's Family and like Jesus we need to go above and beyond to ensure the more vulnerable, less confident and oft marginalised know they are dearly loved by God.
- Children and young people are the church of today not just tomorrow. Their spiritual nurture, faith development and that of their families is an urgent priority and I will ensure Synod does not lose sight of this fact.
- I welcome the fresh approach taken by Synod to invite people in parishes to join the conversation about Living in Love and Faith and I would like to contribute to the next steps in this process at the national level.
- I think the 5-Guiding Principles have helpfully guided the church since the first ordinations of women, but now sense what was intended to hold us together is beginning to fracture and further debate is necessary to ensure the opening statement that the 'Church of England is fully and unequivocally committed to all orders of ministry being open equally to all, without reference to gender' continues to be held true.

- I feel passionately that we need to care for the wellbeing of clergy and laity in the life of our churches, especially in the re-building and healing phase post-pandemic. There is much to be done to ensure doing God's work is life-giving to all and I would like to contribute to constructive action to further the Clergy Covenant, review the Clergy Disciplinary measure and put the well-being of lay officers, on the agenda.
- I am passionate about global and local justice and campaigning and doing all we can to move towards a carbon-neutral church and society and protect the poorest in our world.
- I believe as the church we are Jesus' body, here on earth. All members are to share the good news of Jesus' risen life by his spirit and God's compassion and love for all people. I think in essence the proposed strategy to become a church that is 'simpler, humbler and bolder' is right and I am keen to play a part in making that happen.
