The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship

With its introductory sessions beginning in mid-September, the Bishop's Certificate is Southwark Diocese's 10-month course exploring the Christian faith.

The course covers the New Testament, the Old Testament, being Anglican, Christian doctrine and discipleship. This year there are four groups - two online and two in-person. The online groups are on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, and the live groups are taught in Trinity House on a Tuesday evening or a Saturday morning. It culminates in a residential weekend at Wychcroft, the Diocesan Retreat Centre near Godstone, Surrey, and then a celebratory service in Southwark Cathedral.

The cost is £220. However, we do not want anyone to be prevented from taking the course because of the cost, and grants are readily available.

The Aurora Children's Ministry Course

The new, nine-month Aurora course is for those who are training to be commissioned by Southwark Diocese as leaders of children, young people or families. It covers the spirituality and theology of childhood, faith and physical development, the practice of ministry, and the place of children of various ages in the church.

Parts of the course are taught in-person and others online. Students can follow either a reflective portfolio or more academic level. The cost is covered by Southwark Diocese and a similar course for leaders of young people will begin in September 2023.

Vocations forum



What is God calling you to do with your life? All of us are called to live out our journeys of faith by being faithful disciples in our families, our workplaces, and our social and leisure circles. But for some it involves exercising a form of recognised ministry in the Church. It might be a lay ministry or it might be an ordained ministry. It might be full-time or it might be alongside other responsibilities.

A vocations forum is an opportunity to reflect, pray and discuss with others about what type of ministry God is calling you into. It may be that it is right to enter a process of discernment during which you can talk to an adviser about what is going on in your life. Attending a vocations forum is the first step in that process. You need your incumbent or chaplain to sponsor you to attend, so start with a conversation with him or her. There will be further vocations forums on 19 November and throughout 2023.

Introduction to the Eco Church awards scheme

A Rocha's Eco Church scheme leads you through a series of questionnaires allowing you to examine where care for creation is at work in and around your church. It covers worship and teaching, management of church property, community and global engagement, and lifestyle. More than 140 churches in Southwark Diocese have already engaged with the scheme, and this is a chance for you to learn more and find answers to your questions.

The evening will bust commonly-held myths such as 'listed buildings can never win awards' and 'it's all about changing our building'. With the Diocesan Synod aiming for carbon net zero by 2035, this is the time to start a conversation about what that will look like in your community. Ground Floor Guide to John Calvin



This Ground Floor Guide introduces one of the most important figures in Christian history. In 16th century Geneva, John Calvin emerged as a key theologian of the Reformation. Central to his theology, now known as Calvinism, is the principle that God is absolutely sovereign in the salvation of a human soul from eternal death. His beliefs were controversial at the time and still are now, but his influence on the way we think about the Protestant faith is enormous.

Telling the story of this towering figure and explaining why his theology is important to understand is the Revd Jack O'Grady, who is a curate at All Saints Church with Holy Trinity, Wandsworth.
