

Spring means new life and a hopeful anticipation of the joys of Eastertide, and with it a chance to grow in faith. We are delighted to share our January-April programme of events and courses to inspire you and enrich your Christian journey.

Join us for the Croydon Episcopal Area Lay Conference on 2 March. This day of workshops, prayer, market stalls, and an exciting keynote address by noted theologian Dr Elaine Storkey will help you transform praise and worship of God into passionate action. (Events for the other episcopal areas are being planned - stay tuned for more details!)

Our popular series of Ground Floor Guides continues with introductions to the English Reformations (yes, plural!), and to the season of Lent. This term we're starting a new series called 'Praying with...' all about different types of Christian prayer and spirituality and how you can integrate them into your daily life.

There are also courses and drop-ins exploring Fresh Expressions, godly play, social justice, sport, supporting young people, and much more. These free events are open to all, lay or ordained, and are easy to book.

If you've been thinking about ways to deepen your faith or minister to others, consider booking on one of our two substantial courses beginning in September 2024. The Bishop's Certificate is a ten-month course in Christian discipleship, open to anyone, which covers the Bible, Christian belief, church history, and living out your faith. The Aurora Course is a new programme which equips people to be effective leaders of children and young people. There is a selection process for this course. 


Magnificat! From Praise to Passionate Action: Croydon Episcopal Area Lay Conference

Are you looking for a chance to learn, to think, to reflect and to meet other local lay people? Join us at the Croydon Area Lay Conference on Saturday 2nd March 2024 for an opportunity for just that.

Bishop Rosemarie will open the conference. Our keynote address is from the renowned philosopher, sociologist, theologian and broadcaster Dr Elaine Storkey, who will unpack the wonderful outpouring of praise from Mary about the mercy and goodness of God, and reflect on how Christians might act on that in the light of the challenges of our own day, combining intercession and advocacy with active compassion.

The day will include 19 workshops on a variety of topics led by lay people from Croydon and other

The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship

The Bishop's Certificate is a ten-month course exploring the Christian faith. There are modules about the Bible, being Anglican, what Christians believe, living as a follower of Jesus Christ, and putting your future into God's hands. It is for anybody who wants to be more confident about their faith. You can take the course either online or in person at Trinity House, and there are evening or morning groups. The cost is £220, but no one is ever prevented from taking the course because of the expense.

The Aurora Youth and Children's Ministry Courses

Do you work with children or young people? Join the Aurora Children's or Youth Ministry Course and gain a qualification as a commissioned Children's Minister or Youth Worker, which are formally recognised throughout Southwark Diocese. Aurora is a two-year course comprising the Bishop's Certificate plus specialist training in children's or youth ministry. Anyone can take the Bishop's Certificate, but there is a selection process for those who wish to train for commissioned lay ministry through Aurora.
