The agenda for 2024-2027

Themes for the next three years will include clergy well-being in times of change, environment (including net zero carbon), continuing implementation of the *Anti-Racism Charter*, and parish finances for growth in post-pandemic recovery.


What next?

What is our Vision?

Southwark Vision 2024–2035 is Christ Centred, Outward Focused. It is founded on mutual commitment, speaking well of one another and walking together in the pilgrimage of faith.

In November 2023, our Diocesan Synod approved this vision – alongside plans to develop an investment programme which will resource and support work around six priorities:

- · Maintaining the highest number of stipendiary clergy & growing lay ministries
- Growing our churches & establishing new worshipping communities
- Becoming younger and more diverse
- Deepening our discipleship
- Seeking God's healing for our world

What is Diocesan Synod?

Diocesan Synod is a governance body made up of elected representatives from across our diocese. It is responsible for holding our Diocesan vision and mission, it sets strategy, elects and appoints people to boards and committees and shapes our priorities. It's a statutory institution which serves not only our Diocese but influences and helps to direct the National Church on matters of Church, public and Government policy. It also plays a crucial role in accountability and is the body that scrutinises approves our annual Diocesan budget.

The membership consists of three Houses: Bishops, Clergy and Laity – which all come together to lead our Diocese, enable mission and serve the people of God. Find out more about Diocesan Synod here at southwark.anglican.org/diocesan-synod

Communication: are you receptive and open-minded and do you have the ability to share your passion? Members of Synod are ambassadors – both amongst themselves and as a bridge between our Diocese and parishes.
