Candidate for General Synod

Whoever you vote for, may we, as clergy, pray that whoever represents us would desire the Light of Christ to pour forth from our churches, in both word and deed, they'd long to see us aflame with faithfulness to Christ and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, so that the beautiful and powerful Gospel, the cross and the empty tomb, might be known to many up and down our country.

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I believe I can serve the church as a member of General Synod in three specific areas:

Breadth on Worship: At St Peter's, we fundamentally believe in the message of the Gospel, but no one has a monopoly on 'how' you worship. We have two vastly different services, a traditional Eucharistic service, with developing Anglo-Catholic elements, alongside a low church, informal style (with BCP communion liturgy) with developing charismatic leanings. I believe in a church, at the deepest level (PCCs, budget, governance), that longs to see all forms of worship not only to grow but flourish.

Church Planting & Mission: The wider church hierarchy often 'talk' of new and innovative ideas but have no experience or realism of how that works. We do need new ideas, such as BMOs and 'church plants' but within the tried and tested parish system that gives a framework for the whole body. I am uniquely qualified, having grafted into St Peter's for my first incumbency, and learning the hard way in how to set up a BMO. My desire is to help not only the diocese but the wider church, in making sure that the things that don't work are not repeated, but what does work can be offered to other places so evangelism and mission can flourish.

Accountability & Transparency: Having served on Diocesan Synod and the Diocesan Council of Trustees I have seen the desire to provide accountability and transparency, but this is particularly hard if we are not specific. Therefore specifically, I'd seek:

Accountability that resources are shared amongst all parishes: not just those with larger electoral rolls or special relationships to those on the inside.

Accountability in our discernment process and ordination pipeline: particularly amongst those from lower income backgrounds, educational experience, or theological diversity so that we remain a broad church which welcomes Anglicans in all sorts of shapes and sizes.

Transparency about clergy support: we must address where clergy support has failed and, sadly, continues to not be offered at all.

Transparency about vision, direction, and decisions: we need to know how and where the significant decisions are being made, including around the Strategic Development Fund (or Diocesan Investment Programme, who knows!) and how our resources are used for the mission of the church.
