Summer stretches out before us, and with it the prospect of relaxation and refreshment. We are delighted to share our May-August programme of events and courses to inspire you and enrich your Christian journey throughout the summer.

Our popular series of Ground Floor Guides continues with introductions to the spirituality of St Ignatius of Loyola and to the Baptist denomination - the first in a planned series of ecumenical explorations. A special session on the Church of England and empire will help us think through the implications of a legacy that remains with us to the present day.

There are also courses on leading worship, bereavement care, growing Fresh Expressions, nurturing Lay Ministry, and reducing modern slavery. These free events are open to all, lay or ordained, and are easy to book.

Sign-ups for the Bishop's Certificate - our 'life-changing' ten-month course in Christian Discipleship, which covers the Bible, Christian belief, and living out your faith - are now open. Classes (which you can attend either in-person or on Zoom) begin in September. The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship

The Bishop's Certificate is a ten-month course exploring the Christian faith, taking place between September 2024 and June 2025. It has six modules covering the Bible, church history, what Christians believe, living as a follower of Jesus Christ, and putting your future into God's hands. Those who complete the course are awarded the Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship.

The course is for anybody who wants to be more informed and confident in their faith, read the Bible with more understanding, and reflect on their journey as a Christian.

People exploring whether God might be calling them to ordination, or to be a Reader or Evangelist often take the course. For those training as a Commissioned Lay Pastoral Minister (SPA), a Pioneer, or a Commissioned Children and Youth Leader the Bishop's Certificate is their first year.

However, anybody who wants to love and serve the Lord faithfully will benefit from this course. Most people do it for the joy of growing in faith alongside a friendly and supportive group of fellow Christians.

You can take the course either online or in person at Trinity House, and there are evening or morning groups. The cost is £220, but no one is ever prevented from taking the course because of the expense.

The Aurora Youth and Children's Ministry Courses

Do you work with children or young people? Do you feel God might be calling you to ministry with them? Join the Aurora Children's or Youth Ministry Course and gain a qualification as a commissioned Children's Minister or Youth Worker, which are formally recognised throughout Southwark Diocese. Aurora is a two-year course comprising the Bishop's Certificate plus specialist training in children's or youth ministry. Anyone can take the Bishop's Certificate, but there is a selection process for those who wish to train for lay ministry through Aurora.

Vocations forums

This is a day during which you can reflect on what kind of ministry God is calling you to. A vocations forum is an opportunity to reflect, pray and discuss it with others. Before you attend a day like this you should have a thorough conversation with your vicar or chaplain. They will be able to help you decide whether the time is right to start exploring God's call.

Leading your Church into Growth (LYCiG) conference

You are invited to join Revd Sue Cooke and Revd Anna Norman-Walker (both incumbents in the Kingston Episcopal Area) at the Leading your Church into Growth annual summer conference at Swanwick in Derbyshire. LYCiG aims to encourage hope in the relevance of the local



church and the belief that growth is possible. It equips you with the tools needed to work with your parishes to revitalise your parish and develop a culture of growth.

The course takes the form of an open seminar with interactive talks, practical exercises, workshops and time and space for personal reflection. Sue and Anna will then work more locally with parishes from the Kingston area to mentor, support and encourage parishes when you return from the conference and begin to embed the principles in your own churches.

We strongly encourage you to come in teams from your parish and to have a mix of clergy and lay people - the key to success is working in collaboration with lay people and we find that the parishes who most benefit from the course are those who do not just send the vicar.

The conference fee includes all meals and single occupancy ensuite rooms. There are bursaries for lay leaders available from LYCiG, and the Diocese are also offering financial support to enable parishes to come on the conference.




Ground Floor Guide to the Baptists

The Baptist denomination originated with English Separatists who left the Church of England in the 17th century. But who are the Baptists today, and what do they believe?

In this session, the Revd Dr Simon Woodman, Minister at Bloomsbury Baptist Church and Baptist chaplain at King's College London, will introduce us to the history and the beliefs of the Baptists, how these compare with the Church of England, and how we might work together to share God's love in the modern world.

Thinking about the Church of England and Britain's empire

The relationship between the Church and Britain's empire from the seventeenth to the twentieth century is complex and continues to shape how we think of ourselves as Anglicans in modern Britain today, not least in relation to contemporary racism and the dynamics of the Anglican Communion.



Canon Dan Inman - Precentor at Chichester Cathedral and author of a forthcoming book on the Church of England and empire - will explore how history might help us think through these legacies. Together, we'll pose the question: what might forgiveness and reconciliation in relation to historical sins look like for us today?

Cave, Refectory, Road - monastic rhythms for contemporary living

Cave ~ Refectory ~ Road explores how traditional monastic life is helping to shape new Christian communities such as Fresh Expressions today. Using wisdom from the work of pioneer practitioner Ian Adams, we will explore how this ancient wisdom, learning and spiritual practice might be reinterpreted for new settings.

The first session will look at two spaces that help us to do this: the cave (the place of stillness, prayer and withdrawal that can inspire a new engagement with the mystery of God) and the refectory (how monastic practices of hospitality can create communities that make a difference in the world). The second session will look at the third space that helps us to do this - the road - and how the example of the friars can lead to creative and loving engagement with public life. We will then explore how monastic rhythms for life can bring freedom and creativity to our lives through a new understanding of time.
