# Thy Kingdom Come: Light Up the World in Prayer Nine days of prayer from Ascension to Pentecost 9 - 19 May 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

During Thy Kingdom Come (TKC), our mission is to introduce people to the love of God in Christ, and to see his Kingdom come on earth as in heaven. I am writing to you so that you may feel encouraged in your churches to pray together during the nine days between Ascension and Pentecost.

Last year parishes engaged with Thy Kingdom Come in a number of ways, and I hope this will be the case again this year. As we join in prayer for the evangelistic witness of the Church, I am pleased to commend a range of resources for all ages, for worship at home or together in church. Whichever way you wish to get involved in your parish - I hope these resources will support you and strengthen us all in our mission.

I would particularly like to encourage engaging children and young people to join in, as thousands of young people come together to pray The Lord's Prayer - in one mighty voice - on the day of Pentecost.
