Nominees must be:

- at least sixteen years of age;
- actual communicant;
- on the Electoral Roll of this Parish for at least six months

Proposers and seconders must be on the Electoral Roll of this Parish

No person shall be nominated unless they have signified their consent to serve, or there is in the opinion of the meeting sufficient evidence thereof. No person shall be nominated if they are disqualified from serving by the Church Representation Rules, (See below for details).

*pursuant to Rule 76(1), by providing your email address you are agreeing to:

Notes

1. All members, other than co-opted members, of the House of Clergy/Laity of the Deanery Synod are qualified electors.
2. (1) A person is disqualified from being nominated for membership of a diocesan if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).

(2) a person is disqualified from being nominated for membership of any Synod if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (with that expression being construed in accordance with Rule 71(2) of the Church Representation Rules).

(3) A person's disqualification under sub-paragraph (2) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese by giving the person notice in writing.
