The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship

The Bishop's Certificate is a 'life-changing' ten-month course exploring the Christian faith, taking place between September 2026 and June 2027. It has six modules covering the Bible, church history, what Christians believe, living as a follower of Jesus Christ, and putting your future into God's hands. Those who complete the course are awarded the Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship.

The course is for anybody who wants to be more informed and confident in their faith, read the Bible with more understanding, and reflect on their journey as a Christian. No prior knowledge is assumed, and no essay-writing is required (unless you want to!)

People exploring whether God might be calling them to ordination as a deacon or priest, or to be a Reader or Licensed Lay Minister often take the course. For Commissioned Pastoral Lay Ministers (CPLM), Pioneers, or Commissioned Children and Youth Leaders, the Bishop's Certificate is their first year of training.

However, anybody who wants to love and serve the Lord faithfully will benefit from this course. Most people do it for the joy of growing in faith alongside a friendly and supportive group of fellow Christians.

You can take the course either online or in person at Trinity House, and there are evening or morning groups. The cost is £220, and bursaries and payment plans are available. No one is ever prevented from taking the course because of the expense.

Spiritual Direction provides a valuable opportunity for people to talk about their faith in private with a trained Director. SPIDIR is planning to start a two-year training course for those who would like to become a Spiritual Director (also known as a Soul Friend or Spiritual Accompanier/Companion), in September 2026. The course will be ecumenical but focussed on Christian practise and doctrine. It will likely combine online training sessions using Zoom, plus a number of in-person meetings in central London.

A vocations forum is an opportunity to reflect, pray, and discuss it with others. Before you attend a day like this you should have a thorough conversation with your vicar or chaplain. They will be able to help you decide whether the time is right to start exploring God's call.


Running 'Holidays at Home' for older people Tue 3 Mar, 7:30–8:45pm Zoom, free

2026 marks the 500th anniversary of the publication of William Tyndale's tremendously influential New Testament, which re-shaped the way that English-speaking people read their Bible.

Tyndale was condemned as a heretic by Cardinal Wolsey. His translations were burnt publicly by the Bishop of London. King Henry VIII spent years trying to have Tyndale arrested and executed – finally succeeding in 1536. But why was Tyndale's work so controversial?

Dementia awareness for ministers and carers

This session is for anyone – clergy, lay ministers, or carers – who might interact with people with dementia. It will give an overview of dementia as a syndrome (types of dementia, signs and symptoms, risk factors, and red herrings), getting a diagnosis (and why it can be helpful to), what a person's journey through services might look like, and post-diagnostic support in the community and where to seek help. We'll also cover communication in dementia and co-occurring symptoms that might make care or relationships difficult in a pastoral ministry setting.
