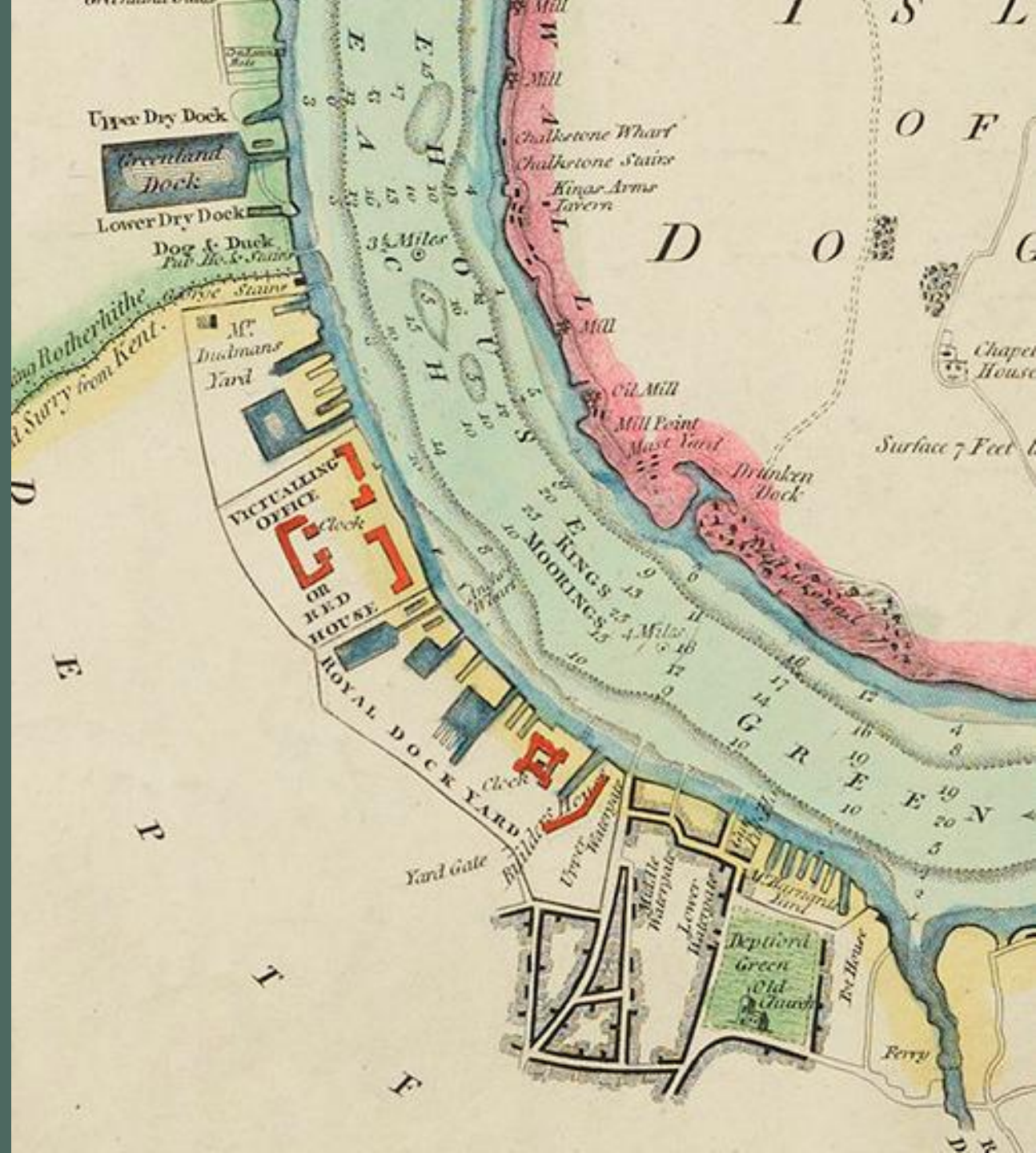

preceding, in the Fleet under  
the Command of V. Adm<sup>l</sup> Sir  
George Rodney, in Action with  
the French Fleet in the West  
Indies.

LIEUT: JOHN BUTT,  
Second Son of PETER BUTT Esq<sup>r</sup>  
who was drowned while in Com-  
mand of an Armed Ship in the  
North Sea, 24<sup>th</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> 1799, Æt 26.  
M<sup>RS</sup> GRACE BUTT, Mother of the  
above PETER and JOHN BUTT,  
died 24<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1824.
